#### COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF THE LINE

This research line analyses the global development and the integration of palliative care into Primary Health Care, exploring the components that determine the activity of palliative care: public health policies, service provision, essential medicines, education, empowerment of people and communities, and research.

In collaboration with the WHO, an original method has been established for evaluating palliative care in the diverse world's countries and regions, following the Sustainable Development Goals and the new framework for Primary Health Care (Astana Declaration). To date, several descriptive regional studies and periodical comparative analysis have been conducted in Europe, Africa, the Eastern Mediterranean Region, and Latin America.

The research group has information about 148 countries and seeks to use Big Data and Artificial Intelligence techniques for their analysis. It also aims at defining health synthetic indicators to facilitate comparative analysis and the design of algorithms capable of predicting the development of palliative care.
